


WELCOMING THE NEW ROMAN MISSAL

On November 27, 2011, the first Sunday of Advent, Roman Catholics in the U.S. will begin praying the Mass using a new translation.

One of the objectives of the Second Vatican Council was to renew the Church's familiarity with and knowledge of Sacred Scripture. The Council specifically called for an expansion of the Biblical texts read at Mass, and this was not only for the purposes of instruction. The language of the Bible is the language of God's revelation of Himself to His people. There are no better words with which to worship God and to grow in knowledge and love of God than those of Sacred Scripture. One of the benefits of having at least certain parts of the Mass in the vernacular was to aid in the renewal of Biblical language for the faithful.

The new translation makes a greater effort to mirror the underlying Biblical passages although we may notice certain departures from the New American Bible, the translation used most often in the readings we hear at Mass. But while other English speaking countries do not use the New American Bible, the translation of the Roman Missal will be the same for all English speaking countries.

PENITENTIAL RITES: When we approach the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we enter into Christ's unique selfsacrifice on the Cross and his victory over sin and death, i.e. the Paschal Mystery. This is an entry into the holiest of actions, and as Proverbs 24:16 re-minds us The just man falls seven times a day. All sin damages our relationship with God, and, in the case of mortal sin, it severs that relationship of friendship. The penitential rite offers forgiveness for all *venial* sin. The penitential rite is not a substitute for the confession for mortal sin (the willful and knowledgeable violation of God's law concerning something of a serious nature), which we are required to confess and receive penance and absolution Based on Preparing for the New Translation by Fr.
